



# Care and Cleaning Instructions

## Meridian Quartz Surfacing

Your Heritage Marble Meridian Quartz has been fabricated by skilled craftsman using premium quality tools and materials. You can protect the beauty of your Meridian Quartz product and ensure a long life of trouble-free service by observing the following suggestions.

### GENERAL CARE AND CLEANING

Meridian Quartz surfaces are easy to clean using warm water and any pH neutral, non-abrasive cleaner such as Formula 409® or Simple Green®, with a clear water rinse.

The following chemicals may be used with caution to remove difficult spots or spills from your Meridian Quartz product:

Ammonia	Lysol® Cleaners	Rubbing Alcohol
Glass Cleaners containing Ammonia	Vinegar	

Caution should be exercised in the use, handling, or storage of any of the above chemicals or products. You should always test these chemicals in an inconspicuous area first.

Certain chemical substances can seriously mar your product's finish, even during brief periods of contact. Protect your Meridian Quartz Surfacing from these harmful compounds:

Clorox® and other Hydrochlorite Bleaches	Oven Cleaner (or any other alkaline cleaners)
Comet® (or any other abrasive cleaners)	Tarnish Removers and Silver Cleaners
S.O.S. ® Pads and all similar abrasive products	Paint Strippers containing Methylene Chloride
Soft Scrub® (or any other product containing pumice)	

DO NOT apply any sealers, waxes, penetrants, or other topical treatments to your Meridian Quartz Surfacing under any circumstances.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Meridian Quartz surfacing is structurally more resistant to surface damage than natural stone. However, all stone and quartz surfaces can be damaged by excessive force or pressure.

2. Meridian Quartz surfaces can be damaged by sudden and rapid temperature changes, especially near the edges, as well as direct or sustained heating of the product. Your Meridian Quartz surface may not withstand the direct transfer of heat from hot pots and pans, electric frying pans and griddles, some crock pots, some toasters and toaster ovens, and heat lamps. Therefore, the use of a hot pad or trivet is ALWAYS recommended.

3. Continuous, long-term exposure to direct sunlight (UV Rays) will result in discoloration of your Meridian Quartz surfacing. This will not apply for most indoor applications.

Your Heritage Marble Meridian Quartz is truly a work of art. With a minimum amount of care, its beauty and durability may be maintained for many years.
